<p>(1) See Dues Allocation Summary for an approximated breakdown of this \$80 fee, which is assessed to each member on a quarterly basis.</p> <p>(2) The \$18 weekly lunch charge is a straight pass-through expense for meal costs as invoiced by the Vero Beach Yacht Club.</p> <p>(3) We encourage all of our members to make this donation to the Rotary Foundation. All proceeds go towards the good things that Rotary International is doing around the world, including the eradication of polio - as well as for international projects we sponsor, such as for our clean water and dental care initiatives that we support in the Dominican Republic. If we have 100% participation from our members in this donation (entitled the "Every Rotarian Every Year" program), our Club is eligible to receive a generous grant that may be used for international projects. Once a member has made \$1,000 of donations to Rotary International, they become a Paul Harris Fellow.</p> <p>(4) Members may obtain credits for attending make-up meetings at other Rotary clubs. For example, since this member was unable to make one of our Club's regular lunch meetings, a make-up meeting was attended at another nearby Rotary club. The member paid the required fee at the other club, and then received the above credit from our Club for doing so.</p> <p>Note that it is also a custom within our Club that many of the members will make donations from time-to-time to Vero Beach Rotary Charities Foundation, our Club's 501(c)3 Foundation (which has donated over \$100,000 to local charities via grants since 1996). These donations are also voluntary, and members most often will make this donation on their birthday. The amount contributed is typically based on their combined years of age, years of marriage, and years as a Rotarian.</p> <p>Members are also given an opportunity each week to donate "Happy Dollars" (by sharing an interesting story to the Membership) and/or may be assessed "Fines" by our Club's Sergeant, all in the spirit of fun and fellowship. All such Happy Dollars and Fines also go to the Club's Foundation, as does 1/3rd of the weekly raffle money. Presently, Members may purchase raffle tickets at the weekly lunch for a chance to win 1/3rd of the raffle dollars as well as an accumulated pot of money - which may be won if the winner pulls a ace of spades from a card deck. If the ace is not pulled, the selected card is destroyed and the final 1/3rd of raffle proceeds is contributed to the pot. These customs act as fun little fundraisers, and allow Members to learn more about each other.</p>
